Come ride the scenic rolling hills above the Temecula Wine Country's De Portola Wine Trail. Enjoy the beautiful Mediterranean-like weather of the Temecula Valley as we ride through the rural country side vineyards and equestrian properties above the Temecula Wine Country. Take in the breathtaking views of the local mountains and the hot-air balloons rising from the valley.

A Competitive Trail Ride is NOT A RACE. It is a timed and measured distance-riding event. Horses of all breeds, including mules, are invited to compete in the NATRC sanctioned divisions. Join us for a fun filled weekend of challenging horsemanship and camaraderie. Bring a friend to ride, or just to help.

This is a sport that welcomes newcomers with open arms. If you are new to Competitive Trail Riding, we invite you to come and ride in the Novice Division. If it has been a while since you rode with us, come check us out again. Let us remind you of how much fun we have!

Join us for a Pot-Luck dinner Friday evening before the Briefing! Management will provide water and coffee. Please bring a dish to share, and something to sit on. Plates and utensils will be provided. Plan on Saturday Dinner with us! All volunteers get free dinner, so bring those volunteers! Vegetarian dinner available if requested in advance.

Camp is located 13 miles north-east of Highway 15 at the Temecula Parkway Exit. The closest gas, groceries and dining facilities are located 8 miles away at Temecula Parkway and Butterfield Stage Rd. (5 miles east of Hwy 15). See driving directions below. Address for GPS and health certificate: 39245 Geisbauer Road, Temecula, CA 92592 (do not mail entries to this address).

We will be camping in a dirt field with horse water and porta-potty available. Dogs on lease are OK. Due to extreme fire danger, no open fires. **No smoking will be permitted on the trail**.

Drinking water will also be available at all P&Rs. Sandwiches, coffee and cold drinks will be available at lunch which will be at camp.

Camp location subject to change if improvements to road are not completed in time.

SCHEDULE OF EVENTS:

FRIDAY April 28, 2017:

- **RIDER CHECK-IN** will begin about 3:00pm. Riders will be provided with a packet that includes their map and rider number.
- PRE-RIDE VET CHECK will be from about 3:00 pm until dusk Friday.
- **FRIDAY POT-LUCK DINNER:** Ride Management will provide water, coffee, plates and utensils. Please bring a dish to share, and something to sit on.
- **FRIDAY NIGHT BRIEFING:** Management will provide a detailed briefing of the trails for Saturday. Bring your map and a pen for writing notes. We will start with a First-Time Rider Briefing to provide additional detailed information and answer questions. (Open to all riders.)

SATURDAY April 29, 2017:

- RIDE begins approximately 7am.
- **SATURDAY NIGHT DINNER:** While we wait for the judges to finish the scoring and prepare for awards for the one-day Novice riders, Saturday Night Dinner will be available for \$10 per person, and free for helpers. So get your friends to come with you and volunteer to help on the day of the ride. The promise of a free meal does wonders!
- **SUNDAY RIDE BRIEFING:** While waiting for scoring to be completed there will be a short review of the trails for Sunday
- AWARDS: Awards will be presented to one-day riders as soon as scores can be tabulated. Awards will
 be given to first through sixth place in all classes of each division. Sweepstakes awards and breed
 awards will be given as sponsored.

SUNDAY April 30, 2017:

- RIDE begins approximately 7am.
- **SUNDAY LUNCH:** While we wait for the judges to finish the scoring and prepare for awards, Sunday lunch will be provided for riders and helpers.
- AWARDS: Awards will be presented as soon as scores can be tabulated. Awards will be given to first
 through sixth place in all classes of each division. Sweepstakes awards and breed awards will be given
 as sponsored.

GENERAL INFO: A saddle is required, but there are no restrictions as to type. Rules now permit most types of hoof boots, even those with straps. Use of wraps, bandages, certain medicine or drugs is not permitted (see the Drug Appendices on NATRC.org). Stallions must be well in hand and ridden by an adult.

STABLING: All Horses must be tied to their trailers or in portable pens secured to the trailer to comply with NATRC rules. Horse water is available. No feed will be available at the ride, but there are several feed stores in Temecula. Bring tools to clean around your stabling area.

TRAILS: Beautiful trails on dirt roads, graded bridle paths and park trails.

BRING: Sun protection lotion, sunglasses, water bottles, camp chair, watch, flashlight and horse blanket. Nights can be cold and often are. A horse blanket is suggested even if you don't blanket your horse at home. Tired animals that must stand all night need the extra warmth of a blanket. Horses are tied to trailers or in portable pens.

Junior competitors must wear an approved equestrian riding helmet at all times on horseback.

Don't let the idea of "Competition" keep you away. If you just want to ride to see what it's like WITHOUT the "Competition" part, try our "Just **DO** it" option. The DO (Distance Only) option lets you ride and get credit for the miles without participating in the "judging" part. This is yet another way we try to encourage new people to come try our sport. The REAL idea is to come have fun with your horses for a weekend!

Driving directions:

If coming South on I-15: Take Temecula Parkway/SR79 exit (Exit #58). Turn left (east at the bottom of the off-ramp and go east on Temecula Parkway.

If coming North on I-15: Take Temecula Parkway/SR79 exit (Exit #58). Turn right (east at the bottom of the off-ramp and go east on Temecula Parkway.

After exiting on Temecula Parkway: Go east on Temecula Parkway 8 miles to the signal light Anza Rd (after road changes to 2 lanes). Turn left (north) on Anza Rd, then in approx. ½ mile, turn right at the stop sign on to DePortola Rd. In 6 miles, at 1st stop sign at Glenoaks Rd, DePortola changes to nonmaintained road. The blacktop changes to dirt road in about ½ mile. At approximately 1 mile from the stop sign at Glenoaks Rd, turn right on Geisbauer Rd. Camp will be approximately ¼ mile on the right. DIVISIONS

NOVICE – This division is designed for riders that are new to this sport. Horses entered in this division must be at least 48 months of age. Mileage will be about 20 miles on Saturday (two 10 mile loops with lunch in camp in between) and approximately 15 miles on Sunday. This division has classes for Junior, Lightweight and Heavyweight. Refer to Rule Book for details.

COMPETITIVE PLEASURE -- Horses entered in this division must be at least 48 months of age. CP riders will ride about 20 miles on Saturday (two 10 mile loops with lunch in camp in between) and approximately 15 miles on Sunday. CP riders may ride with the Novice riders. CP is for any riders 10 and over. Those horses and riders not eligible to compete in the Novice division, or more seasoned horses and riders who would rather not compete in the Open division, may enter this division. CP is all in one class.

OPEN -- Horses entered in this division must be at least 60 months of age. Mileage covered will be about 25 miles on both Saturday and Sunday. This division has classes for Junior, Lightweight and Heavyweight. Refer to Rule Book for details.

CLASSES

HEAVYWEIGHT -- Open and Novice rider and tack weigh 190 lbs. and over.

LIGHTWEIGHT -- Open and Novice rider and tack weigh 100 lbs. through 189 lbs.

JUNIOR -- Open and Novice, ages 10 through 17. If age 17 on January 1 of the current year, the entrant will ride as a Junior for the remainder of the year. Juniors may choose to compete with adults in the Open division if they can make the weight requirements. Juniors may not ride stallions and must have a responsible adult in camp. Juniors must wear ASTM/SEI or other approved EQUESTRIAN riding helmet while mounted.

NATRC Information: This ride is being conducted in accordance with the current NATRC rulebook. If you need a copy of the NATRC rulebook, it is available on the NATRC.org website. Rider must be a current NATRC member or pay a NATRC non-member fee. Ask about the free 2017 membership for new NATRC members.

For breed recognition on the NATRC ride, breed registration papers must be included with the entry form or shown at check-in. If no registration papers are presented, the horse will be listed as Grade.

RIDE STATEMENT OF LIABILITY WAIVER The following must be signed and dated for entry to be valid:

I WISH to enter and participate in the Spring Fling Competitive Trail Ride, to be held at Temecula CA on from April 28-30, 2017.

I HAVE READ the rules, conditions, and regulations of the event and will comply with them. I AGREE to abide by the rules of the North American Trail Ride Conference and the aforementioned ride. I UNDERSTAND that competitive riding involves being in remote areas for extended periods of time, far from communications, transportation, and medical facilities; that these areas have many natural and/or manmade hazards which ride management cannot anticipate, identify, modify, or eliminate; that horses can be excitable, difficult to control and unpredictable; that personal belongings can be damaged, lost, or stolen, and that accidents can happen to anyone at any time. I AGREE to assume all risks associated with my participation in this activity, and I accept full responsibility for myself and the animal I am riding.

As a condition precedent to my being allowed to participate in this activity, I agree that I WILL NOT SUE OR BRING ANY CLAIM AGAINST THE NORTH AMERICAN TRAIL RIDE CONFERENCE, ITS DIRECTORS AND/OR OFFICERS, RIDE MANAGEMENT, RIDE PERSONNEL, VOLUNTEERS, PROPERTY OWNERS WHOSE LAND THE RIDE CROSS, AND/OR ANY OTHER INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS THEREOF, (HEREAFTER REFERRED TO AS "THE RELEASED PARTIES") FOR ANY INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH AND/OR LOSS OF ANY KIND WHICH ARISES OUT OF THIS EVENT, AND WILL INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS THE RELEASED PARTIES FROM ALL LIABILITY FOR SUCH INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH OR LOSS, EVEN IF SUCH INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH AND/OR LOSS ARISES FROM THE ALLEGED NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASED PARTIES. Junior riders must wear an ASTM/SEI, Snell, or approved equal equestrian riding helmet at all times while mounted.
