If you are new to Competitive Trail Riding, or are an experienced rider, we invite you to come and ride in our Leisure Division (LeD) ride. The Leisure Division has Experienced, Adult, and Junior classes. This division offers shorter miles, slower pace, and allows you to complete the ride all in one day.

Check-In in the morning, Ride 8-12 miles, and have awards all on that same day. Camping is not required, but is available with or without corrals. Leisure is only offered as a one-day ride, but you can enter Saturday, Sunday or both days, and make a weekend out of it. Each day is a separate ride, with scorecards and awards issued after each day.

We host a Silent Auction with proceeds going to ride expenses. Bids will be taken for item both days and the highest bid on Sunday afternoon wins. Bid can be paid by PayPal, Venmo or check. Items won must be picked up at event site on Sunday afternoon, unless other arrangements are made with the Ride Manager. The ride will begin and end with 2 miles on flat, Sandy jeep trails. The rest of the ride will be a mixture of sandy washes, cow paths, and mountain trails with beautiful views. There will be stock tanks providing plenty of water for the horses.

The trail is well marked with specified minimum and maximum riding times printed on your map. A Competitive Trail Ride is **NOT A RACE**. It is a timed and measured distance-riding event. Horses of all Horse breeds and mules are invited to compete. Join us for a fun filled day, or weekend, of challenging horsemanship and camaraderie. Take this opportunity to enjoy some great scenery with your horse. Bring a friend to ride with, or sign up to volunteer.

Enter this ride on the NATRC Ride Management System <http://rms.natrc.net> Entries also accepted by regular US Mail. Pre-entry is required. Entries close Tuesday October 6, 2026.

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MEALS: There will be a meal provided on Saturday evening for an extra fee of \$15.00 per person.

We will try to hold the briefing for the Sunday ride after the meal on Saturday, if all the Sunday riders are not present, the briefing will be held Sunday morning before the ride.

CAMPING: Dry camping is available at \$10/night without corral, \$20/night with corral, or \$30/weekend with corral. Camping is NOT required for Leisure, if you arrive and leave the same day, however, if you stay the night at Unforgiven Ranch, camping fees apply

Open fires, loose dogs or other pets are NOT PERMITTED.

STABLING: PORTABLE CORRALS ARE ALLOWED ON THIS RIDE (ATTACHED TO TRAILER). All stabling options permitted by NATRC are allowed at this ride, including portable corrals, tie to trailer and "Hi Ties". See NATRC Rule Book for additional details.

MANURE, SHAVINGS, AND/OR HAY: Bring tools to clean up your stabling area. If using a corral, please leave your manure in a pile outside of the corral. If not using a corral, there is a big pile of manure on the property where your manure can be dumped. Please do not mix trash in with manure.

SMOKING: No smoking will be permitted on the trail or in camp (if you must smoke, it must be inside a private vehicle). Anyone caught smoking on trail or in camp will be disqualified and asked to leave.

DOGS: Dogs are allowed on a leash and controlled in camp only. No dogs on trail. Per NATRC Dog Policy, dogs are not allowed in any common area, such as check-in, briefing, awards or group meals.

AWARDS: Awards will be presented as soon as scores can be tabulated. Awards will be given to first through sixth place in all classes of the division. All horses/mules and riders are encouraged to stay for the awards presentation.

SADDLE: A saddle is required, but there are no restrictions as to type. It is recommended your horse be shod or wear boots. Rules now permit most types of hoof boots, even those with gators. Use of wraps, bandages, medicine or drugs is not permitted.

SILENT AUCTION: Items will be up for bid and will have minimum bid amounts. Bid sheets will be with all items. Bids will be taken both Saturday and Sunday. After the ride on Sunday, the auction closes. Go by, see if you have won any items. Multiple payment options available, options will be posted in Silent Auction area. DO NOT bid on an item if you do not intend to follow through with the purchase. All items must be picked up after the Sunday ride unless previous arrangements have been made.

JUNIOR PARTICIPANTS: Junior riders must wear an ASTM/SEI, Snell, or approved equal equestrian riding helmet at all times while mounted.

DOWNTOWN KINGMAN: Kingman, Arizona offers a blend of historical charm, outdoor recreation, and economic opportunities. It's known for its location along historic Route 66, proximity to the Grand Canyon, and a vibrant community. The city also boasts a large industrial park, diverse business landscape, and various recreational amenities. Kingman hosts 5 feed/supply stores as well as large department chain stores. There are many restaurants from fast food to fine dining.

WHAT TO BRING: All food for you and your horse. The only food that will be provided to participants will be the pre-paid dinner on Saturday evening. Saddle, bridle, pads, grooming equipment, buckets, hay nets and anything you need for camping out with your horse. A blanket is also suggested for your horse, even if one is not normally used at home. Your horse may be tired, and the nights can get cool. Rain gear is also suggested, just in case. Bring tools to clean around your stabling area. There will be water available for your horse, but no other water usage is allowed.

Also, bring your personal camping gear, tent, camper, LQ, sleeping bag, canteen, sun protection lotion, sunglasses, water bottles, hat, flashlight and analog wristwatch, etc. There are two porta potties on the property that will be stocked with hand sanitizer and toilet paper.

NOTICE: UNFORGIVEN RANCH IS LOCATED IN FREE RANGE. COWS WILL COME INTO CAMP. BE SURE TO SECURE ALL FEED FOR YOUR HORSE!

DISTANCE ONLY (DO): Don't let the idea of "Competition" keep you away! If you want to ride to see what it's like **WITHOUT** the competition part, or if you are mentoring a new rider, try the "Just DO it" option. The **DO** option lets you ride and get credit for the miles without participating in the "judging" part. This is yet another way we try to encourage new people to come try our sport. Riders choosing the **DO** option will receive mileage credit, but will not be eligible for placing in classes. The **REAL** idea is to come and have fun with your horse for a weekend!

TENTATIVE SCHEDULE OF EVENTS:

Friday October 9, 2026

Camp will open at 2pm. Early check-in will be available between 4:00pm and 6:00pm. If you plan to arrive after 6:00pm on Friday, check-in on Saturday morning. While camping is not required for Leisure Division, camping will be permitted both Friday and Saturday nights, if desired.

Saturday October 10 2026

7:00 am - Check-In at registration will be between 7:00 am and 8:30 am - Briefing and maps, immediately followed by checking in with untacked horse with the Judge. As soon as all riders have checked in with the Judge, the riders will be given 30 minutes to saddle up.

10:00 am - Riders will time out as soon as all riders are saddled up. Riders are welcome to arrive the night before, and stay until Sunday, if desired.

3:00pm Awards - As soon as scores are tallied.

Riders are encouraged to stay for Awards.

5:00pm - Dinner is served! There will be water provided with your pre-paid meal, please bring any other beverage with you.

If ALL Sunday riders are in camp, Sunday Briefing will follow awards. Otherwise it will be on Sunday morning

Sunday October 11, 2026

7:00am - Check-in at registration will be between 7:00am and 8:30am - Briefing and maps, immediately followed by checking in with untacked horse with the Judge. As soon as all riders have checked in with the Judge, the riders will be given 30 minutes to saddle up.

10:00am - Riders will time out as soon as all riders are saddled up.

AFTER RIDE - Silent auction ends. Go by, see if you have won any items. Multiple payment options available, options will be posted in silent auction area.

3:00pm - Awards - As soon as scores are tallied

(ALL TIMES SUBJECT TO CHANGE)

LEISURE : Horses entered in this division must be at least 48 months of age. Mileage will be about 8-12 miles. Ideal for riders who want to try Competitive Trail Riding without camping. The pace for the Leisure Division is between 3 and 4.5 mph, basically timed at a walk.

LEISURE DIVISION CLASSES

EXPERIENCED: The Experienced class for Leisure is open to all Adults, with no weight classes. It is intended for the more experienced rider so that they will not be competing with riders that are just starting out.

ADULT : The Adult class for Leisure is open to Adults, with no weight classes. It is intended for Riders who are starting out with Competitive Trail. Open to riders with less than 250 lifetime points with NATRC, or some other events as described in the Rule Book.

JUNIOR: Ages 8 through 17. The rider must be 8 years old to enter competition; thereafter the age of a junior shall be determined by whatever their age is as of the beginning of the ride year, and this age shall continue throughout that ride year. Juniors may choose to compete with adults. Juniors may not ride stallions and must have a responsible adult in camp. Juniors must wear ASTM/SEI, Snell, or other approved EQUESTRIAN riding helmet while mounted in camp or on trail.

The preferred method to register is through the RMS website! We do have people that can walk you step by step through the process. If you must do paper registration, the entry form is provided. If you do not already have an account set up in RMS, one will be created for you. This is required to participate in the ride.

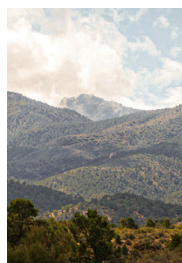


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We do require a \$25.00 deposit per day/person that is non-refundable. We ask that all riding fees be paid no later than October 6, 2026, unless prior arrangements have been made with the ride manager. This allows for a smooth registration process and saves the ride time and money.

RIDER LIABILITY WAIVER

The following must be signed and dated for entry to be valid:

I WISH to enter and participate in the Hualapai View Competitive Trail Ride, to be held at Unforgiven Ranch on October 11-12, 2025. **I HAVE READ** the rules, conditions, and regulations of the event and will comply with them. **I AGREE** to abide by the rules of the North American Trail Ride Conference and the aforementioned ride. **I UNDERSTAND** that competitive riding is a high risk activity, which involves being in remote areas for extended periods of time, far from communications, transportation, and medical facilities; that these areas have many natural and/or man made hazards which ride management cannot anticipate, identify, modify, or eliminate; that horses can be excitable, difficult to control and unpredictable; that personal belongings can be damaged, lost or stolen and that accidents can happen at any time. **I AGREE** to abide by the rules for participation in this activity, and I accept full responsibility for myself and the animal I am riding. As a condition precedent to my being allowed to participate in this activity, **I AGREE** that I WILL NOT SUE OR BRING ANY CLAIM AGAINST THE NORTH AMERICAN TRAIL RIDE CONFERENCE, ITS DIRECTORS AND/OR OFFICERS, RIDE MANAGEMENT, RIDE PERSONNEL, VOLUNTEERS, PROPERTY OWNERS WHERE EVENT TAKES PLACE, AND/OR ANY OTHER INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS THEREOF, (HEREAFTER REFERRED TO AS "THE RELEASED PARTIES") FOR ANY INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH AND/OR LOSS OF ANY KIND WHICH ARISES OUT OF THIS EVENT, AND WILL INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS THE RELEASED PARTIES FROM ALL LIABILITY FOR SUCH INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH OR LOSS, EVEN IF SUCH INJURY, ACCIDENT, DEATH AND/OR LOSS ARISES FROM THE ALLEGED NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASED PARTIES. I FURTHER ACKNOWLEDGE THAT I HAVE READ AND UNDERSTAND THIS STATE'S EQUINE ACTIVITY LIABILITY ACT WARNING (IF APPLICABLE), A COPY OF WHICH IS ATTACHED HERETO AND INCORPORATED BY REFERENCE HEREIN. I HEREBY CERTIFY THAT MY HORSE IS NOT UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF MEDICATION AND WILL NOT BE TREATED WITH OR GIVEN ANY MEDICATION PROHIBITED BY NATRC TM RULES. I HEREBY GIVE PERMISSION TO THE NORTH AMERICAN TRAIL RIDE CONFERENCE OR THEIR DULY APPOINTED AGENT, TO TAKE ANY APPROPRIATE ACTION DEEMED NECESSARY TO CHECK FOR POSSIBLE ADMINISTRATION OF DRUGS TO MY HORSE."

Junior riders must wear an ASTM/SEI, Snell, or approved equal equestrian riding helmet at all times while mounted.

To the extent any dispute arises out of this agreement, the parties agree to submit said dispute to binding arbitration before a neutral arbitrator mutually selected by the parties, said arbitration to be conducted in accordance with the Rules of the American Arbitration Association. All such arbitrations shall be held in the county or district where NATRC National headquarters are located. If the prevailing party, NATRC shall be allowed to recover all costs and expenses incurred, including attorney's fees and costs.

DIRECTIONS TO CAMP

Search for ride venue address 5683 Taos Dr Kingman AZ 86401 on Google Maps or Apple Maps.

I-40 E/US93 S: About 6 miles east of Kingman AZ. Take Exit 49 from I-40 at DW Ranch Road. Turn left on S DW Ranch Rd.

I-40 W/US93 N: About 6 miles before Kingman AZ. Take Exit 49 from I-40 at DW Ranch Road. Turn right on S DW Ranch Rd. There is a Loves Truck Stop on the north side of I-40 at this exit. Continue past the Loves Truck stop headed North.

Both off I-40 - At S DW Ranch Rd: Just past the interchange, the road changes names to Minerva Ln as it goes around the corner. Follow Minerva Ln as it passes the Loves Truck Stop on the north side of I-40. About a mile up, the road changes name again to Round Up Rd. Turn left on Taos Dr. The ranch will be on the right just after the turn. Look for parking signs.
